# Clochette

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## Gauge

6 stitches/inch, in  
stockinette stitch on US 4

## Size

Newborn, (3months, 6  
months, 9 months, 1-3  
years)

## Materials

50 grams light worsted or  
dk in natural

1 oz green in light worsted  
or dk

## Needles

DPT's US 4 or 2 US 4  
circular needles

Crochet hook US E-4

## Notions

- Stitch markers
- Darning needle
- Stitch holder

# Clochette

The hat is knit from the bottom up. The petals are started individually, then joined together. After they are joined, the hat is knit in the round.

## Petals:

Make 5 petals.

Petals are knit one by one, going back and forth in stockinette stitch.

Cast on 3 stitches.

R1: P1, PM, P1,  
PM, P1

R2: K1, M1, SM,  
knit to next marker,  
SM, M1, K1

Repeat R1-R2 until  
the petal is 14, (16,  
17, 20,22) stitches.  
Finish with a purl  
row. Break yarn.  
Place petal on a  
holder. Make a total  
of 5 petals.





## Body of Hat

Transfer all petals to your circular needle. With the knit side of the petals facing you, place petals to join round, but before you join the round being careful not to twist, transfer the last stitch of the last petal to the needle in your left hand, place a marker. This will be the beginning of your round.

Knit petal 1, CO1 using backward loop between petal 1 and petal 2.

Continue knitting each petal in this fashion, casting on 1 stitch between each petal, until all petals are joined. You will have 70, (80, 90, 100, 110) stitches total.

Continue knitting the hat in the round as follows.

Hat Round: K1, P1, \* K14, (16, 17, 20, 22), P1\*. Repeat from \* to \* ending K13, (15, 16, 19, 21).

Repeat this Hat Round until the hat is 4", (5", 5.5", 6", 6.5") high, measuring from where the petals are joined.

## Crown:

Decreases for the crown will be placed on each side of the purl stitches that separate the petals.

Round1: K1,\* P1, K2tog, knit until the last 2 stitches before the next purl, SSK \*

Repeat until you are one stitch away from the end of your round. Move the marker one stitch to the left, you will now have 2 stitches before your marker, SSK these last 2 stitches before the marker.

The marker is now the new start of your round.

R2: Knit the knits and purl the purl stitches separating the petals.

R3: \* P1, K2TOG, knit until 2 stitches before next purl, SSK \* Repeat until end of round

R4: Knit the knits and purl the purl stitches between the petals.

Repeat R3-4 until 7, (8,9,12, 14) stitches are left between the purl stitches. Then repeat R3 every round until, you have 5, (4, 5, 6, 5) stitches left between the purl stitches separating the petals. Then K2 tog until you have a total of 7 stitches left.

Switch to the green yarn, and knit a 7 stitch i-cord. Knit the i-cord until it is 3/4" tall. Gather the stitches of the i-cord with a darning needle, weave in ends.



## Leaves:

Cast on 5 stitches using green yarn.

R1: K2, YO, K1, YO, K2

R2 and all even rows: Purl

R3: K3, YO, K1, YO, K3

R5: K4, YO, K1, YO, K4

R7: K5, YO, K1, YO, K5

R9: SSK, K9, K2TOG

R11: SSK, K7, K2TOG

R13: SSK, K5, K2TOG

R15: SSK, K3, K2TOG

R17: SSK, K1, K2TOG

R19: Sl1, K2TOG, PSSO. Fasten off.

Make another leaf.

Using a length of green yarn and a darning needle, applique the leaves to the hat.

Weave in all ends.

Using a crochet hook, and white yarn, crochet one row of single crochet along the bottom edge of the hat to set the curl of the petals. Weave in any remaining ends.
